

Samoon Foundation has launched another 'Samoon Sewing Training Center' in Purwal village, Tehri Garhwal, with the aim of making women self-reliant and independent.

In March, a request was received for opening another sewing and weaving training center in Purwal village, Tehri Garhwal. Considering this, on Saturday, April 1, 2023, five sewing machines along with chairs, tables, and other materials were delivered to the village of Purwal. Additionally, with the aim of making women self-reliant and independent, the Samoon Foundation has launched another 'Samoon Sewing Training Center' in Purwal village, Tehri Garhwal. On May 12, 2023, a formal inauguration of another 'Samoon Sewing Training Center' was held in Purwal village, Tehri Garhwal. However, women from Purwal and nearby villages had already been learning sewing at this center since April. This is the 5th sewing and weaving training center operated by the Samoon Foundation. Previously, hundreds of women and girls from areas such as Tuddangi-Devprayag, Rumdhar-Hindolakhal, Lwah-Chamoli, and Akhodi-Tehri Garhwal have benefited by learning sewing, weaving, and embroidery at similar centers.







The villagers and local residents expressed their happiness and gratitude to the Samoon Foundation for opening the sewing center. They showed eagerness to learn sewing, and more than 25 girls/women have already started learning sewing. Vinita Ji, a trained woman from the village with extensive sewing experience, is providing training to the women of the village. We hope that many more women and girls from the nearby villages will benefit from the sewing and weaving training offered at this center.

Kotdwar, Pauri Garhwal, has been struggling with kidney disease for the past 6 months and has been surviving on dialysis. The doctors have suggested a kidney transplant as the only solution, with an estimated total cost of around 1 million INR. One of Himanshu's parents wanted to donate a kidney to save their son, but due to the family's dire financial situation, raising such a large amount was impossible for them. Himanshu's mother cleans utensils in people's homes, earning a monthly salary of 1,500 INR, and his father works as a laborer.

To assist this poor family, a small amount of financial aid was provided by the Samoon

Foundation. The Vice President of Samoon Foundation, Mr. Vijay Mohan Panyuli gave a cheque to Himanshu's family as support from the Samoon family for his kidney transplant.



The construction work of Samoon Adarsh School building is in progress.

Date – Sunday, May 14, 2023

In the previous financial year 2022-23, land levelling for the construction of the Samoon Adarsh School building was completed. In May, the foundation work began, and the construction of walls started.

The construction work is proving to be more challenging than initially anticipated. Due to the extremely difficult terrain, no contractor or labor is readily willing to work there as there is no mobile network, no electricity, and no road access. Reaching Osla village requires traversing 16 kilometres of rugged, footpaths, along with dealing with severe cold, snowfall, and rainy weather.

Despite offering attractive wages, three contractors rejected our offers. However, the work has restarted and is progressing rapidly. By May 2023, we have invested ₹12 lakh in the construction of the school building.

Although there have been delays, the work is progressing with high quality, and we will soon achieve our goal. The construction of the school building is made possible through the donations and efforts of all the esteemed members of the Samoon family, especially Mr. Ramesh Inderdutt Naithani, to whom we express our deep appreciation and praise.



Date – Thursday, June 1, 2023

Heavy torrential rains, occasional snowfall, hailstorms, biting cold, and the even greater

challenge of a 16-kilometer footpath to the project site, where there is no electricity, no network, no first aid, and no machinery to expedite the work—despite these complex problems, we remain steadfast in our mission for the bright future of the children of Osla village. Gradually, the work on this magnificent temple of Goddess Saraswati is progressing, and the day is not far when the grand building of Samoon Adarsh School will be ready. This has been made possible through the exemplary support of all the esteemed members of the Samoon family, for which you all deserve our deepest gratitude.



Date - Thursday, June 1, 2023

During the two months of heavy rainfall in July and August, all the roads leading to Osla, the last village in Uttarkashi, were completely damaged. As a result, we were unable to transport construction materials to Osla via the 16-kilometer footpath, and were compelled to halt the construction work on the school building.

Date - Monday, September 4, 2023

In September 2023, the rain stopped and the roads cleared, allowing us to resume transporting materials by mule. Therefore, the construction work for the Samoon Adarsh School building has restarted, with the aim of completing it by March of this session so that the school can move into the new building for the next session.

With the special support of Mr. Ramesh Inder Naithani, work is progressing, and so far, ₹20 lakh have been spent. It is estimated that an equal amount will be needed to complete the project, for which Mr. Naithani has assured every possible assistance.




Date - Saturday, June 18, 2023



A cheque of ₹11,000 was provided for Vikas's medications after he suffered fractures in both legs due to a road accident. Additionally, two months' worth of rations was provided, and Pihu's school registration was renewed, along with payment of the outstanding fees.

Tuesday, July 11, 2023

In Kathud Village, Patti Sitonsyun, block and district Kot, Pauri Garhwal, Vikas Kumar was working as a driver while living in a rented room in Rishikesh, supporting his family. On March 3, 2023, while returning from Gadankhal after dropping off passengers, his vehicle lost control and fell into a deep gorge. Thankfully, Vikas survived, but he suffered fractures in both legs. For three months, he was confined to bed at home, there being his wife, Mrs. Neema Devi, and their two children. The family's financial situation became so dire that Vikas did not have money for treatment, there was no ration at home for food, and his daughter's name was removed from school due to non-payment of fees, leaving her at home. They had not paid rent for their room for a long time.

On June 20, 2023, a request was made to honorable members of the community and the general public for help for the family.



Wednesday, July 12, 2023

The Samoon family delivered two months' worth of rations to Vikas's family at their home and assured them that additional support would soon be provided for expenses such as their daughter's admission, room rent, and medical costs.



Thursday, July 19, 2023

Pihu was very happy to go back to school. Her father, Vikas Kumar, had suffered fractures in both legs due to a road accident and had been bedridden for three months. The Samoon Foundation team took immediate action by re-registering Pihu at school, paying the outstanding fees, and covering the advance fees for the next year. They also provided a cheque for ₹11,000 for Vikas's medications and delivered two months' worth of rations, assuring the family of continued support in every possible way.

The Samoon family has been playing a leading role in social work in Uttarakhand for several years, made possible through donations from its esteemed members. For Pihu's family, the Samoon Foundation received a donation of ₹20,000, which includes ₹10,000 from Arvind Ji in Dubai and ₹5,000 from Ajay Rawat Ji in Pipalkoti.




Samoon Foundation transferred a small amount of ₹15,000 to the account of Miss Babita, daughter of the late Shobat Singh.

After my father's death, my mother barely earns enough to buy groceries, so I walk without them." Mr. Jethudi then asked, "If I buy you sandals, will you wear them?" The boy quickly said yes and led him to a nearby shop, where Mr. Jethudi bought him a pair of sandals. As the boy ran off wearing them, his joy was palpable, as if Mr. Jethudi had given him a precious gift worth millions.

Mr. Jethudi felt a deep sense of happiness and wanted to share this experience, hoping others would also help those in need around them and feel a unique sense of self-satisfaction.

Additionally, he incurs a daily transportation cost of ₹500 for traveling to and from the hospital.

To care for Mahavir, his wife and two young children also live with him in the rented accommodation. The Samoon Foundation provided a small assistance amount of ₹16,000 for Mahavir Rana's treatment and assured further support for his ongoing medical care.






The Samoon Family provided a small financial assistance check of ₹17,000 for the treatment of Miss Bindi, who is bravely battling a serious illness like cancer.

The confirmation of Bindi's cancer diagnosis brought a heavy burden of sorrow upon the family.

Although Bindi is receiving treatment through an Ayushman card, the impoverished family does not have enough money for the travel expenses from Gairsain, room and food costs in Rishikesh, and for medications. Upon learning about the Samoon Foundation through someone, her mother submitted an application at the organization's office. The foundation took immediate action and provided a small assistance check of ₹17,000 on February 12, 2024, assuring further support as needed.

The elderly mother was seen begging in Rishikesh by Rajni Rana, a member of the Samoon family. Rajni approached her to ask what problems she was facing at her age that forced her to beg.

The elderly woman explained that her husband had passed away long ago, and she lived with her daughter. Unfortunately, the son's wife, who was the elderly woman's daughter-in-law, also passed away, which drove the son to madness, and now he has disappeared.

This situation forced the elderly woman to beg, as her small grandson had a fractured leg and the poor family could not afford the treatment. To verify this information, Samoon family member Jitendra Jerdhari immediately visited the elderly woman's home and confirmed the situation.

At that time, the family needed assistance for the treatment of the child's fractured leg and some rations. The Samoon family appealed for help on social media, and for four days, the Samoon family team visited the elderly mother's home, took her grandson to the hospital for treatment, purchased medicines, provided rations for the next two months, and gave ₹1500 in cash for future medications, assuring them of further assistance as needed.


